Clay's Corner

Over the course of the last several months, we as a congregation have experienced many changes. Some have been negative. Most have been very positive changes. Another very positive change has been in the number of responses of people asking for prayers from their brothers and sisters in Christ as they struggle with life and the issues at hand. One of the negative changes we've seen in our congregation, not just in the last several months, but over the course of the last several years, is the number of people who attend Sunday evening worship services. And it is to this negative change that I address this article.

A huge challenge to any minister and any congregation is the challenge of how to take the negative things that affect a congregation and turn those things into something positive. As a course of action the men have discussed for the last several months the best way to address the Sunday evening worship attendance; how we can best utilize the time given to us on the first day of the week to maximize the spiritual growth of each individual while also allowing that life, for each individual and family group, has placed many demands on their time and energy.

As a part of our continued effort to grow spiritually we have decided to pursue a different format for what we do with Sunday afternoons and evenings. We have not set anything in stone as of yet, but for one thing, and that is, that we will be changing the way we do things on Sunday evenings.

One of the things that we will be doing is setting aside two Sundays per month where our youth group will be involved in various activities of service to God by serving others. This will include participating in the monthly singing and devotional at the Heights. They will be having devotionals and doing things together as a group on a more regular basis. Kevin and Victoria are going to be instrumental in setting up, planning, and carrying through with the growth of our youth group. I believe that God has richly blessed us with this young couple and we intend to use their talents to help our youth group grow spiritually and numerically.

We are going to be looking at setting up small group Bible studies in various homes in Gonzales and the surrounding communities, and also personal studies with the Minister and his wife (Mary and me). Mary and I will be working one on one with each of our families to help them grow in their faith and empowering them to reach out to others with the healing hope of the message of Salvation. There are many other possibilities and we are researching and developing them even now, to further the cause of Christ in our respective communities.

Time and space do not allow me to detail all the changes that will be taking place in the near future. So I close with this final thought. Growth, whether it be spiritual, physical or otherwise never happens without something changing. And change from what is seen as normal or traditional to something unknown or nontraditional puts most of us at unease. Humans do like their comfort zones. Very few, if any, of us are exempt from this characteristic. Some will even fight it. But change is a necessary part of growth. Without the one you cannot have the other. And so, as we move towards the light of a new day for this congregation, I seek to instill in all of us the desire to do whatever it takes to draw us nearer to God and closer to being the servants we have professed to be.

May God richly bless us as we seek to do His will in our world.
