### Clay's Corner

"Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

- Hebrews 10:23-25. ESV

Taking the passage from last week's Clay's Corner I am going to expand on the important positive thoughts that are found in this passage.

The message of the Bible is overwhelmingly profound. Taken in context, one can find the answers to almost every question, every desire, every care, and every concern in life. Throughout scripture, I have found certain passages that just blow me away with the simple logic that God has given us, pertaining to life as Kingdom inhabitants. This passage from Hebrews is one of them. And I want to expand on its thoughts over the next week or two. Last week we considered how, taken out of context, we have used this passage in a negative sense. But I want us to consider the positive aspects of what the Hebrew writer is telling us in this passage.

And I want to begin with this excerpt: "Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works."

Here we have a specific directive to believers to contemplate new ways to encourage one another with the primary goal being to stir each other up to a more Christ like life. And I wonder how many people, in our congregations over the years, have only read this passage as a means of solidifying a personal agenda; without considering the importance of it in their own task of teaching others, the Godly attributes all Christians should possess: love and good works?

I just returned home this morning from the Tuesday morning men's prayer breakfast. 40-45 minutes of my time gone. I'll never get that time back. And I do not regret a single moment of it for I do not consider that I have wasted a solitary second doing what I did. Why? Because I joined with five other men of our congregation that we might consider ways to stir one another up to love and good works and to seek God's guidance, consideration and approval for all that we are doing here in Gonzales.

Looking for the positive instead of worrying about the negative and the results are evident in our congregation. And for that I am thankful. Have a blessed week! See you next Sunday!

### SPECIAL UPDATE

"Cancer is not a downhill slide, it's a roller coaster. Almost three weeks ago, I posted that Justen's doctors had told us we had about two months. Then, a few days later, we were told that we actually only had about two weeks, based on the fact that his bone marrow was 95% leukemia cells. We were also told at that time that when we started to see a lot of leukemia cells in his bloodwork, that the end was very near. I didn't put this information on Facebook because it was too painful. I'm telling you now because for the last two weeks, there have been NO leukemia cells in his bloodwork. NONE! That's not to say that they aren't still in his marrow. It just means that we will continue to have Our Sunshine with us. Who knows for how long? Certainly not the doctors! Only God has Justen's days numbered. He is the only one in control. Justen has had an exciting week but we've also gone to the ER. Ups and downs. Roller coaster for sure! Glory be to God for the exciting ride!"
