

Clay's Corner

“And Levi made him a great feast in his house, and there was a large company of tax collectors and others reclining at table with them. And the Pharisees and their scribes grumbled at his disciples, saying, ‘Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?’ And Jesus answered them, ‘Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I have not come to call the righteous but sinners to repentance.’” - Luke 5:29-32

Several things have happened to me or around me in the first three days of this week that have caused me to question several things about who I am in relation to Jesus. Last week I talked about our call to holiness. I mentioned that my greatest desire is to be mistaken for Jesus. I doubt that will ever happen. But it is a worthy goal. And I believe with all that I am that it is a goal that we are all called to as followers of the Christ.

Now, I said all that to say this, as of this writing, I have had conversations with three different people and one referral from whom I hope to hear from soon, all from different walks of life, three locals, one distant, two I know personally, two I’ve never met face to face, all of them in different situations... but all facing the same problem: Evil and its effects on their lives.

And as I have attempted to minister to these individuals one thing kept coming to the forefront as I listened to them tell me their stories, explain to me their hurts and express their desire to find something better; their language. “Be Holy for I am Holy,” kept creeping into my mind as I listened to the very language that I have tried so hard to distance myself from in my own walk with the Lord.

The question kept coming up in my thoughts, “At what point do I ask them to refrain from using such foul language?” Do I tell them right off that I do not tolerate such language and risk alienating them? Or do I accept them in their environment for now and seek to build a relationship before I lead them to the true healer of all things physical and spiritual? How can I work in this? What do I do? My desires are to reach out to these people? Yet, if I immediately begin to point out their obvious shortcomings I risk having them walk out the door, never to return. Many have taken that risk and failed. Many have drawn lines in the sand and said I can’t help you until you learn to do this or do that.

So, I turned to scripture for the answer. And I came across this story of Jesus and Levi. The Pharisees didn’t deal with these people because they were sinners. They wouldn’t give them the time of day much less carry on a discourse with them about their spiritual needs; except to point out their failings. Jesus on the other hand, accepted the invitation and walked right in among them, course jesting, foul language, and all, and sat down with them to eat and begin a relationship.

I don’t recommend this to just anyone. You can’t be weak and do what the Lord did. Neither too, can you be self-righteous. But you must be able to look beyond the obvious. One must be willing to listen to the Spirit of the soul and ignore the noise of the world in order to accomplish the will of the Father. For indeed it is the sick who have need of a doctor, not the healthy or the righteous. And a real doctor treats disease, not symptoms.

As such, at some point a doctor will tell the patient what must be done in order to be well. But, first he must make a diagnosis. In order to make the diagnosis he must examine the patient. He cannot do that without being in close proximity to the patient. So Jesus sat and ate with the sinners. So too then, shall I.

In the coming weeks, I hope the fruits of my labors will pay off in the harvest of souls. I hope you’ll join me in prayers this week that this will be the case.
