

Why you don't love Les Miserables as much as you thought you did

You might have seen the recent musical movie Les Miserables and declared that you love it. But you probably don't love it as much as you thought you did.

Victor Hugo wrote the massive book Les Mis for 2 reasons. 1) He wanted to make a living. 2) He wanted to change French culture in the mid-19th century. The French economy was in ruins after the political upheavals that began the 19th century and it was a time where there was a sharp divide between the "Haves" and the "Have Nots." The term "Les Miserables" means "the miserable" or "the poor."

In the book (spoiler alerts on!) Jean Valjean is imprisoned for stealing bread and the sentence is lengthened for a failed escape attempt. When Jean Valjean is released from jail, he turns to crime to live because no one would help him. He stole silverware from a priest that took him in. The authorities captured him and took him to the priest. Valjean stated that the priest gave him the silverware as a gift. In a surprising move of grace, the priest affirms this lie and in fact gives Valiean the expensive silver candlesticks as well. The priest commands Valiean to use the money to become a decent human.

Now here's where the book and the movie part ways for a second. In the book, Valjean immediately follows this act of unmerited grace by stealing money from a boy. He is overcome with guilt. He tries to find the boy and give back the money but he cannot. Even though he was forgiven, he was still a criminal at heart. Years later, Valjean became a factory owner and the mayor of his town, but he could not find redemption. He became aware of the plight of one of his workers who was fired due to a corrupt system he put in place in his factory. This woman, one of the countless "Miserables," was Fontaine. Valjean pledged to the critically ill Fontaine that he would care for her daughter. The rest of the book follows Valjean as he keeps the promise he made to Fontaine to watch over Cosette. It is in caring for Cosette that he finally finds the absolution of his earlier life.

I love Les Mis, but it makes me really uncomfortable as well. The challenge of this is not to love people from afar, but to love them and accept them personally. Valiean did not love "Les Miserables" as an abstract class of people but he became personally involved in the life of one person. Valjean's life changed when he invested his life in the life of one individual.

Jesus has said that the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to "the least of these." He spent his time among "Les Miserables" of his day. He invested in them. As his followers we have the same call. This call is beyond giving money to a cause, but to personally know and interact with another human. How do you think that personally investing the life of one person living in poverty, desperation, or despair would change your life? Do you really love Les Mis after all?
