Jesus the Great Equalizer

Do we ever compare ourselves with other people? Either by looking down on ourselves or the other person. We can sometimes find ourselves saying I wish I could be this way, or I wish they would be this way. When we do this, we usually aren't trying to find commonalities with that other person and are too focused on the differences. This may be fine by human standards, but this is not the way of the New Testament. The common theme found New Testament there is commonalities between all people. Paul often found and used a common thread with his audiences. That takes ability and we don't all have that ability, but there is a common theme we all can relate to no matter what our cultural, ethnic, or economic differences. "For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard." (Rom.3:23). We all need something that erases that.

This week, chapter 23 in The Story speaks about the man who does this for us, Jesus. And this week He is beginning His ministry and is showing us, He is that leveler. John used two opposite characters to illustrate the truth of 3:16. God's love for the world reaches from the moral, educated, cleaned-up religious Jew to the nameless, immoral, downand-out Samaritan. One was well off and highly regarded by his people. The other was a twice rejected woman, rejected by the Jews, and even her own people. By standards of mankind it would be hard to see any time when these two people had anything in common. They did and so do we. We all have one thing in common: our need for eternal life in Christ Jesus.

Throughout this chapter and the next we can see that Jesus truly did come for all people everywhere. He pulls us either up to Him or down to Him depending on what we need to be right with God. Jesus through His ministry shows us God's love for His world and the importance of us truly seeing Him as He is the Son of Man. It's not always easy for us to see Jesus for who He really is, sometimes mankind still has misconceptions of Who this Jesus is. But it is important to realize one thing Jesus is for all mankind is the great equalizer. "There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Gal. 3:28)
