

Enduring Patience

There has been a lot of things said, shared, and expressed the last couple weeks with so much going on in the world. Opinions on the matter of the virus or economy are being shared. There has been so much time and conversations circling this thing which we don't really understand or know much about. I don't know about y'all, but my and Paige's heads have not really stopped spinning from this ordeal. The changes that have been put in place for the moment dealing with community gatherings and schooling are uncharted waters. This is definitely a historical time that we maybe really wish we didn't have to deal with. There's definitely a lot of opinions on this matter we're going through. I felt the overwhelming presence of mass media and social media before, now it's off the charts how much interaction between these platforms is taking place. I've interacted with people in ways I never thought I would two weeks ago. How fast things have changed has been rather scary. It certainly reminds us of how uncertain life is.

I have found it interesting how people are responding to what is taking place. I have to say faith seems overall high across the board. People are sharing and encouraging other believers. On a whole I don't think our immediate faith and response is at risk right now. My reading plan had me begin the book of Job yesterday. Reading the early chapters of Job provokes some interesting thought, given the current climate of the world right now. The book of Job is deeply relevant to us readers today. We all experience suffering and pain. Taking wisdom literature in school my teacher Charles Speer made the comment that frequently our reaction to trials is like Job's. At the beginning of his testing, he reacted positively with the statement, "The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praised" (1:21). But as time wore on and the trials, aggravated by the false accusations of his friends continued, Job's patience gave out. He was finally reduced to saying, "It profits a man nothing when he tries to please God" (34:9). But though Job's faith stumbles a little, God's faithfulness did not. He stayed with Job until he had learned the lesson of God's sovereignty, and then he gave Job twice as much as he had before.

The longer this ordeal continues the harder it might become to keep face and keep faith. Having a firm foundation for our faith is a must. Job's name is only mentioned once in the New Testament, but it is huge timely mention "Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful." (James 5:1) God's purposes truly are compassionate and merciful, even in suffering. This may be hard for us to accept. But we should learn to let God be God and know our wisdom is far inferior to that of the creator and sustainer of the universe and our lives. Job wished for a redeemer, an advocate. We Christians have Jesus Christ.
